October is a great month of the year in Melbourne, it's when the first real warmth in the weather appears, the blue water and the snapper return but it's also a time to be careful on the water as October and early November can be a windy period on the bay. Make sure you check the forecast on the bay before heading out, keep an eye out on the clouds and wind while on the water and let someone know where you are going and how long you are out for and when you will be returning. Let's keep ourselves safe this summer.

Mordialloc Creek Community Update

The Mordialloc Creek Community continues to meet and be hosted by MMYC and we are also undertaking the secretarial work for the community at this stage.

The Mordialloc Creek Community has been meeting over the last 12 months to look at the issues that are affecting everyone in the creek including dredging of the creek. Council has recently moved to relinquish management over the creek and is currently in the process of handing this over to DEWLP. This will be assessed over the next 6 - 12 months as the Mordialloc Creek Community's future structure is developed.

DEWLP has secured \$100K in funding to develop a master plan for the creek and surrounding environs and this will assist in developing the future management of the creek to ensure it is responsive to the needs of users and also in promoting and improving the health of the creek.

Participants in the meetings include, representatives of both State and Federal governments, Councillors and staff of Kingston City Council, Parks Victoria, Melbourne Water, Mordialloc Sailing Club, Mordialloc Fishing and Angling Club, Pompei Marine, Allnutts Marine, Beaumaris Conservation League and of course our club. MMYC club member John Wilson and myself attend the meetings with Greg Power and Peter Banham and I must thank John for his amazing work at chairing these meetings and in bringing this group together. Its important work for us all!
